


## Illegal and Unsafe Shooting Near Crystal Lakes Subdivision


### Tiny Bob Road (Illegal Campground)

- Association will partner with USFS to permanently close the illegal campground.
- Work scheduled for May 10 – 14, 2021, weather permitting. Alternate work week is May 24 – 28, 2021, which is right before Memorial Day weekend.
- Association will provide heavy equipment (front loader, backhoe, skid steer, trailer) and operators (Field Staff) and USFS will provide personnel.
- Association will stage heavy boulders near work area, weather permitting. Ideally, the rocks need to be 3' to 4' in size.
- USFS will relocate “no shooting” sign closer to Tiny Bob Road.
- USFS will provide a gate, hardware, and posts that will be installed on one of the forks. The other fork will be blocked along with the OHV path south of the campfire. The gate will allow administrative vehicle access to the national forest.
- Association will procure four (4) “Private Road, No Trespassing” signs and four (4) “No Parking” signs along with posts and hardware.
- Association will schedule a community cleanup event to pick up all the brass, beer bottles, drug paraphernalia, and other trash. Volunteers will need to sign a waiver. Association will provide trash bags, gloves, bottled water, etc. We will take pictures and may submit an article to the North Forty.
- Association will ask USFS to provide grass seed to help restore the area.
- Association will provide a plat map to the USFS that shows the road easement.



## Tiny Bob Road (Dozer Line)

- USFS's goal is to have an awarded contract for removal of the Tiny Bob decks mid-summer. It is the second deck sale they will be putting out after Cameron Pass.
- USFS prioritized the sales based on critical safety issues, so the Tiny Bob decks are in the high priority group.
- Once they have an awarded contract, the contractor will have a year to remove the decks, but it is likely the timber will be removed sooner to avoid damage from winter weather.
- The timber contract will be written to stipulate that operations should take place during daylight hours and after roads have firmed up to avoid neighbor disturbance and rutting of the road surface.
- USFS will place t-posts (continuing as necessary when the existing ones are vandalized) at the junction to the Tiny Bob dozer line as a temporary solution until the log decks are removed. A more permanent solution, such as Kelly humps and boulders will follow once the log decks are removed.



## Deadman Road

- Association continues to partner with USFS, LCSO, DNS, and Commissioner Kefalas on the shooting closure.
- USFS will provide status of cooperative law agreement between USFS and LCSO.
- USFS is scheduling law enforcement "saturation patrols" for all holiday weekends and at other random times.
- Shooting restriction signs have been installed at Tiny Bob and Deadman illicit shooting pull-off locations. Other target shooting prohibited signs will be placed at all junctions where roads cross into the national forest and where forest service roads cross into the closure.
- The closure goes along Deadman Road to Kilpecker Road (USFS Road 300) which is about 3.25 miles from the forest boundary. Association is requesting an additional sign be placed on Deadman Road

at the forest boundary that says, “No recreational sports shooting next 3.25 miles to Kilpecker Road (USFS Road 300).” We will coordinate with USFS and LCSO to confirm accuracy and enforceability.

- USFS will block access to dozer line that is accessible from the Fire Route 502 campground. The Association is concerned that off-road vehicles will use these “roads” to trespass into our subdivision.
- USFS will start repairs with vehicle barriers on all dozer lines as soon as conditions allow, and the goal is to have all repairs completed this fall. USFS will prioritize areas like these where there is a direct connection to a community.
- USFS provided a Cameron Peak - Suppression Repair map that shows the dozer lines near Crystal Lakes. It appears that some of our dozer lines are missing from the map.
- Association will inquire with USFS as to how the shooting closure is being advertised. USFS previously mentioned using their website and social media.
- Association inquired as to the timeline for the construction of the Devil’s Nose Shooting Range. USFS stated that funding had been secured and that when this range opens, closures in Larimer County will be triggered. USFS said the construction contract will be awarded this summer with construction to follow in late-summer or fall of 2022 with opening likely to occur in 2021. These are best estimates.
- Association asked if any tickets had been issued. USFS said they were unaware if Larimer County has issued any tickets.
- Association will send a postcard in late April informing property owners in Filings 7, 9, and 14 of who to call if they see or hear illegal shooting taking place.
